Buildings of the World Series Japan Gasshozukuri

The Gasshozukuri style of building has been used since ancient times in Gifu prefecture. The architecture is perfect for farmers with large families living in areas which see heavy snowfall. There are many layers in the roof, which are also used for in the silkworm culture industry that flourishes in the area. Nails are not used in this building style; instead, the pillars and crossbeams are tied together with ropes. In 1995 the villages of Shirakawago and Gokayama were registered as international cultural assets.

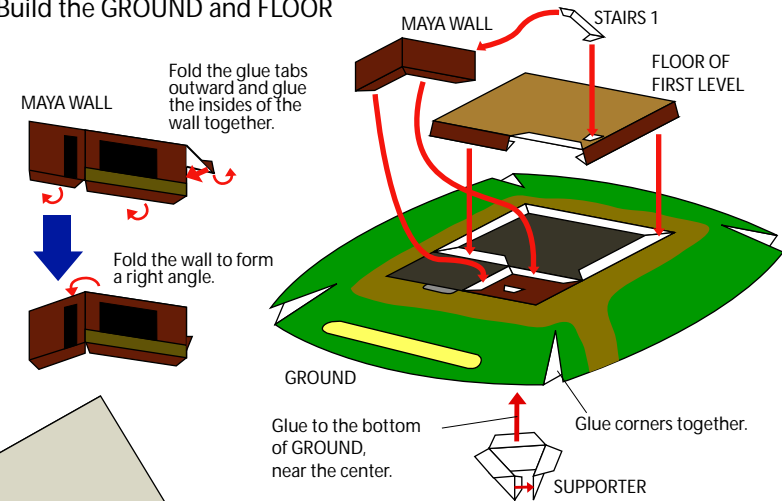

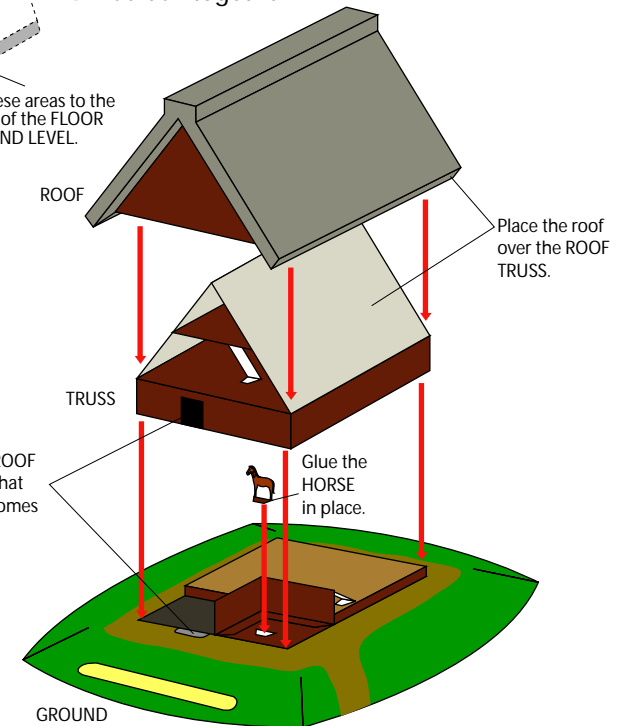
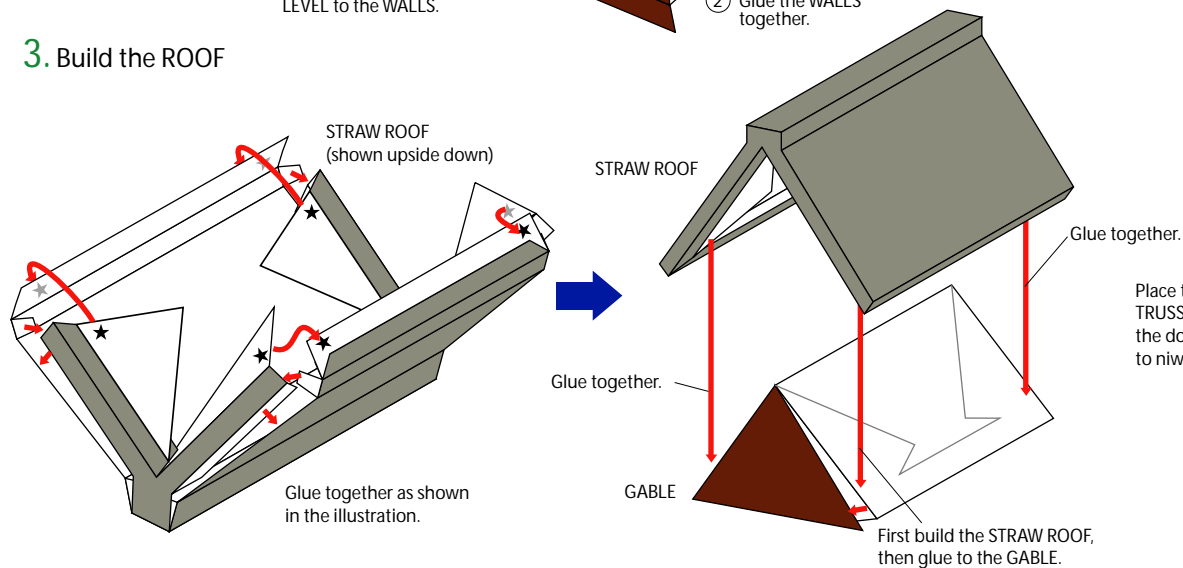


2. Build the ROOF TRUSS

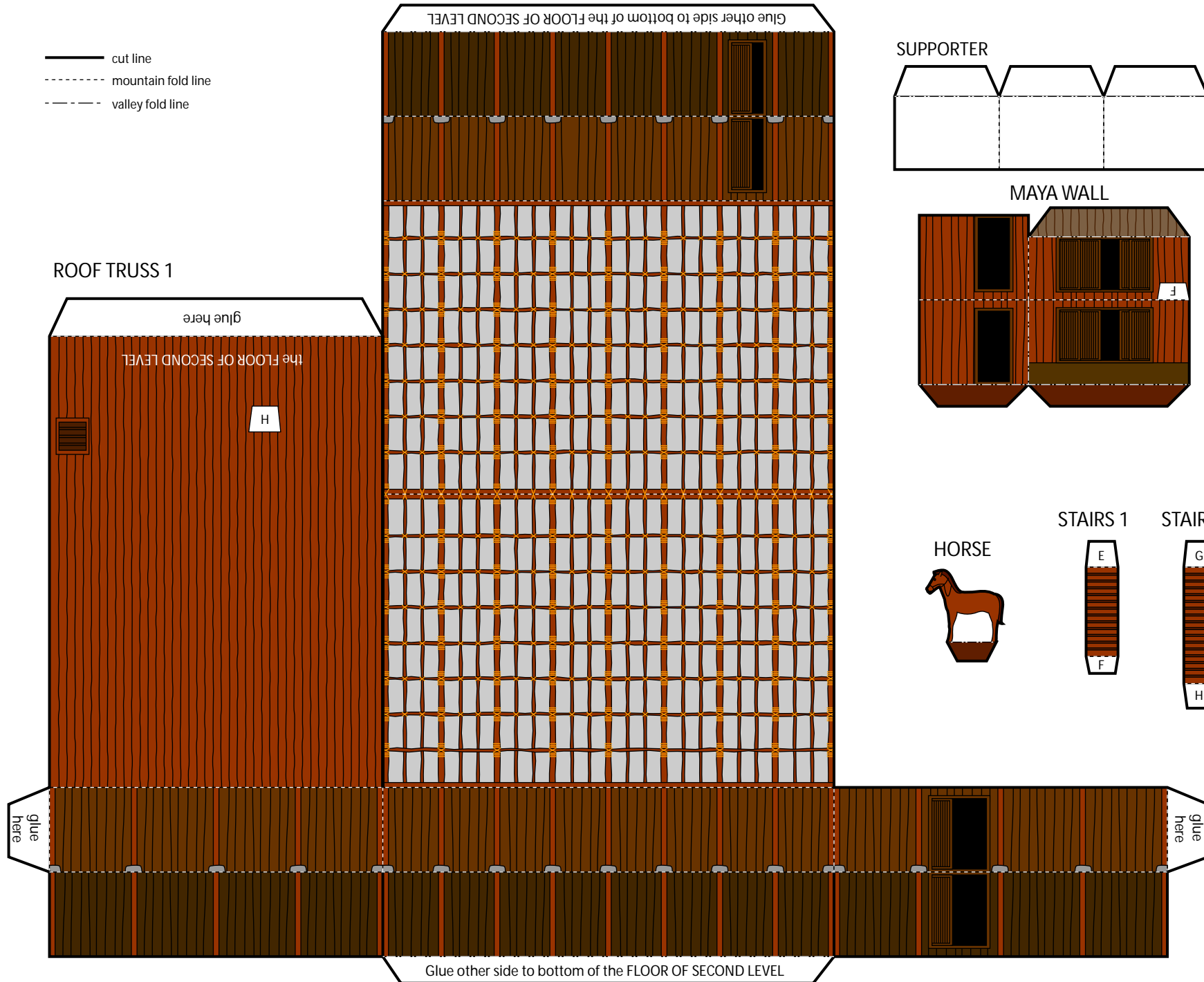

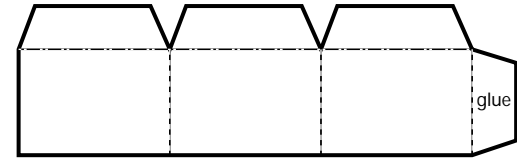

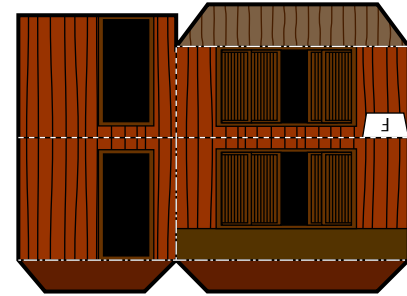

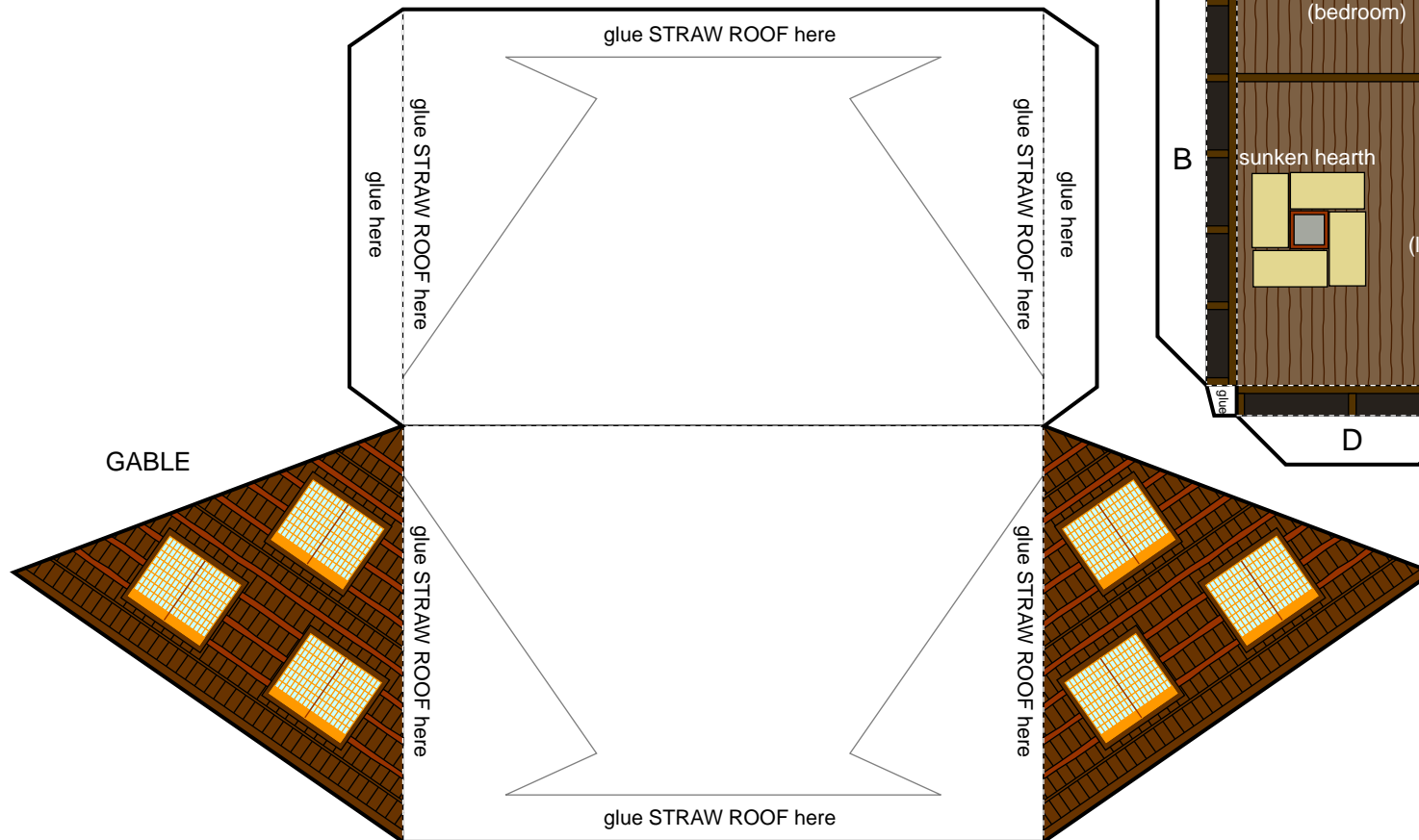
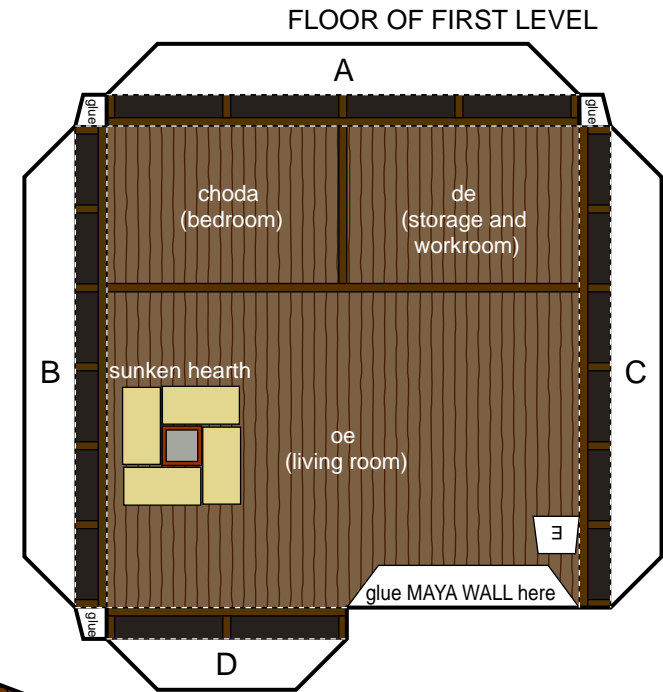
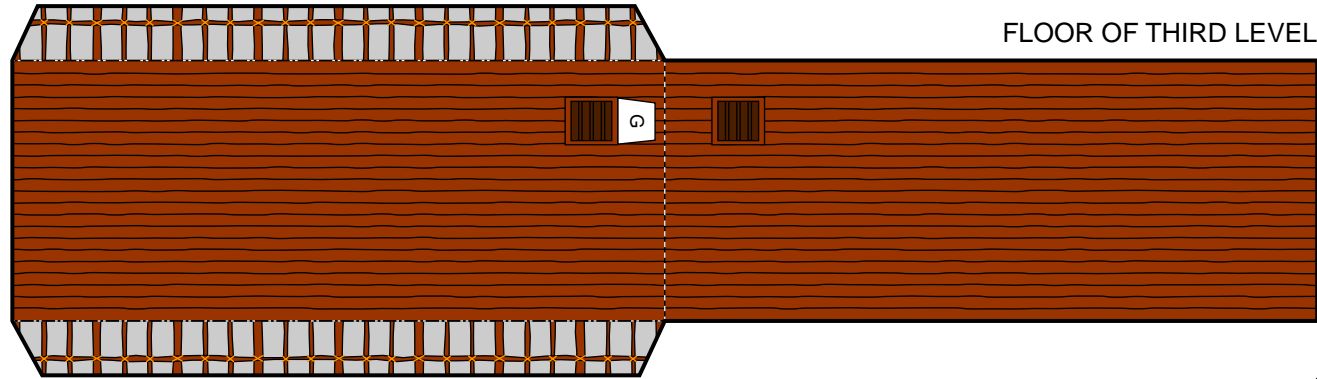


STAIRS 1



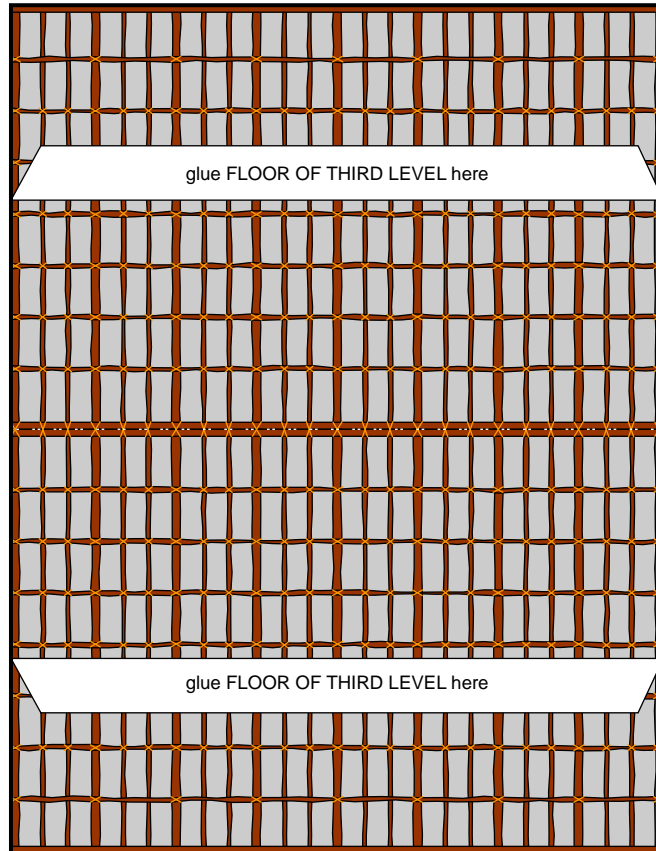

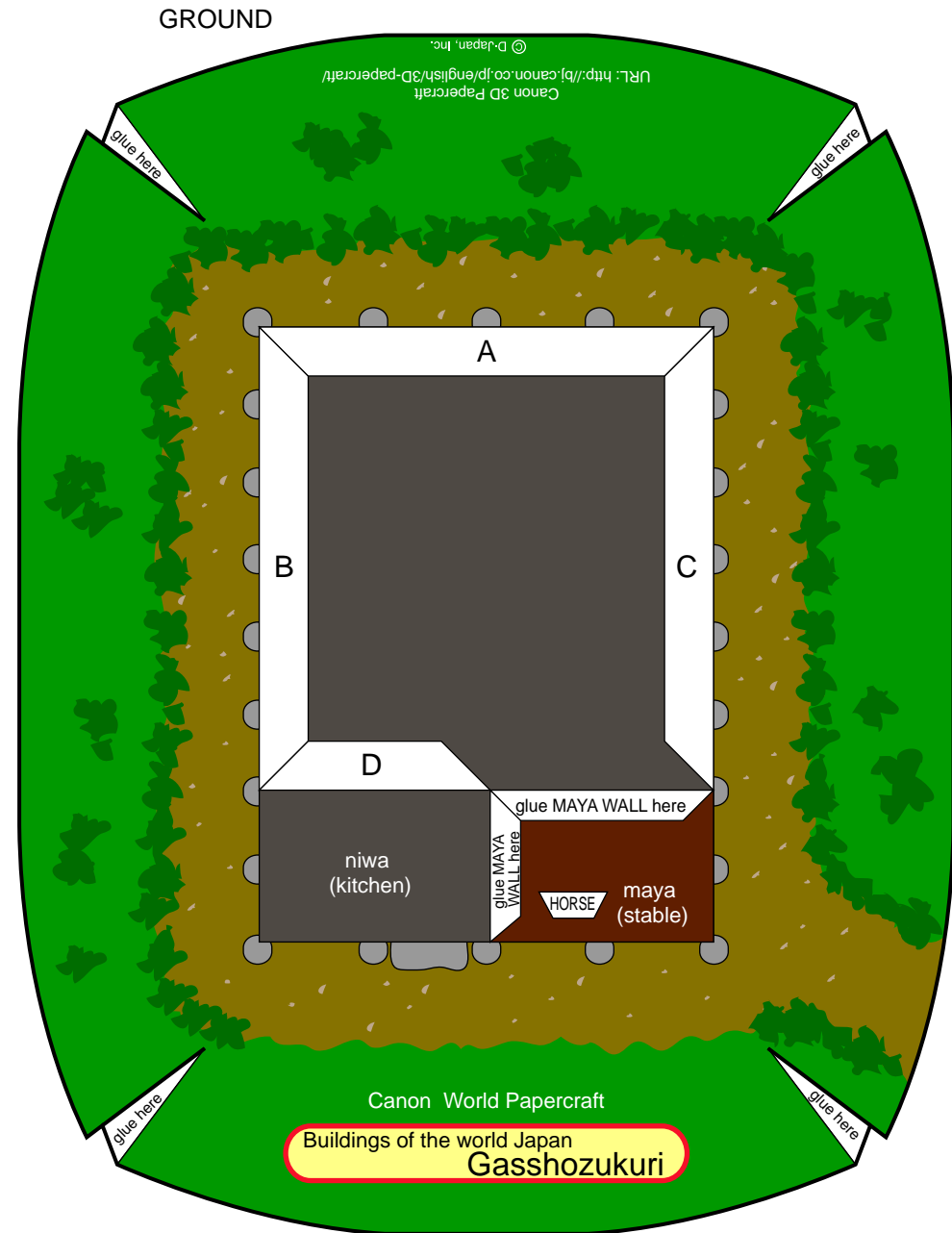
